Dear Friends of FVPC,

As I return to a full time role at FVPC, my concern has specifically turned to the effects of trauma on each family member experiencing family violence.

Let us take a look at trauma and the influence of this in our own lives. Each of us can recall experiences from our childhoods that provoked anxiety such as being lost in a store, walking by the scary neighborhood dog, spelling bee contests, picking teams in gym class and the list goes on. Some of the experiences that I have identified as anxiety producing could cause trauma, but FVPC works with children and adults that have lived through more negative and adverse experiences.

Trauma is defined as a deeply distressing or disturbing experience with psychological and physical implications. The frequency, intensity and duration of traumatic situations logically influence the extent of the impact on a person.

The impact of trauma influences the development of the brain, emotions, and the physical body. The impact yields long-term effects on the entire person starting from the age when the trauma occurred, into the future. Children and adults who are exposed to high intensity trauma, such as exposure to violence in the home directed at others or at themselves for extended periods can bear lifetime effects.

Too many of us are paying the impacted price for trauma either personally or as a society. The Center for Disease Control has done a great deal of research regarding the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) which indicates high correlation to mental health concerns such as adjustment, anxiety, depression, addiction and suicide. Further, serious physical health complications such as heart disease, obesity and cancer are linked to the number of ACEs a person experienced as a child.

For children and adults with adverse childhood experiences the pain is derived from a powerful relationship that should have been safe. Hence, relationships can be the venue where healing happens. Having a teacher who understands and believes in you or a trusted friend you can confide in may mitigate the long-term effects of early trauma.

As we promote connection to one another in the community, we all have a role and interest in reducing the painful effects of trauma. Friends of FVPC have multiple ways to help with reducing these effects. First, you can share with others that FVPC is here and ready to help. Second, you can volunteer to support the activities that FVPC does to provide trauma informed interventions. Third, you can assist us with the needed Wish List items that allow us to provide daily, safe support. Fourth, you can boost the organization's financial stability through contributions now and through bequest giving. As friends of FVPC so many of you do these activities already which allows us to build caring relationships with those who have been traumatized and assist them in their healing journey.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

This October, let us honor National Domestic Violence Awareness Month by promoting peace in our own homes and communities. Domestic Violence is too common and consequential to stay quiet. Speak up!
Wear Purple! Post your photo to our FB page and get the conversation started. Stand up and against language that allows violence to spread. You can take part in the campaign to take a stand against violence by joining us for the Candlelight Vigil on Oct. 2 (6:00 pm).
