FVPC has been having a very productive season! First, I would like to express a giant "Thank You" to many of you for supporting the "Denim & Diamonds" themed Uncommon Affair. It was a spectacular evening and I was so enthused by the positive energy present in the Fairground's Assembly Hall. I had a lot of fun and enjoyed chatting with dear friends and supporters of the

The evening generated necessary operating funds, which our budget depends on, but it also gave us an opportunity to highlight our programs and services and the deep impact they have on our community. After an evening such as this, I leave with a full heart because I am reminded of how many people care about us and the victims we serve.

We also completed our flooring project, which is highlighted here in the newsletter. I am proud of the outcome and the efforts that it took to undergo such a big transformation.

During the past two years, I have been promoting the spirit of "partnering". Staff members have been encouraged to consider our work as a "partnering/together is better" effort with survivors and their family members, fellow community agencies, churches and corporations.

Just this week, we received notices of two examples of how partnering works. Following the Uncommon Affair and through a board member connection at Universal Technology Corporation (UTC) in Beavercreek, they chose us to benefit from their "Casual for a Cause" efforts. Additionally, a past board member and the director of Xenia Adult Recreation and Services Center contacted me this week and shared they had gathered flip-flops during the month of June and will be bringing them over for the survivors in the safe house. Flip-flops will be perfect to slip on and size will not be as crucial in giving them away.

I am grateful for corporations and workplaces that recognize the needs in their own communities. If other places would like to make an effort on our behalf, please consider the following methods that would be relatively simple to accomplish, but make a real impact and stretch our budget.

- Casual dress day/week for a cause
