This environmental picture is a good description of Family Violence Prevention Center's role in the lives of the many survivors that we serve. The deep colors of family and relationship violence are crushing and life altering. In Greene County an individual is more than twice as likely to experience family or relationship violence than to be diagnosed with a new case of any type of cancer (Ohio Family Violence Prevention Project 2010), yet we are there in the middle, offering hope to these individuals.

Our direction for 2012 is to ensure that individuals and families who need hope will find hope through the services of the Center. There are many opportunities for you to help provide hope. You may select to offer support through volunteering - sharing your talents; donating - providing in kind or financial assistance; and talking - spreading the word FVPC is here, poised to serve those who are struggling with family and relationship violence.

The Board Room: Perspective on 2011

Your Family Violence Prevention Center has completed 2011 successfully. Given the general environment across the philanthropic horizon, that is something FVPC and its Board can take pride in. But we cannot rest as the challenge remains.

Our annual budget is a bit over \$1 million. Considering we are running a 24/7 operation, providing education and crisis services across the county and housing 22 individuals, that is barebones.

from state and federal grants. About 6% comes from locally generated government sources, including primarily a mandated share of Marriage License and Divorce filing fees. For the balance (over 30%), FVPC relies on local philanthropy. Private local foundations historically provide about 13%. The United Way of Greater Dayton provides a

critical 10%. And the balance comes from individuals – you our community supporters.

Where does it all go? You likely ask that about your personal budget. With a 24/7 operation providing professional service it likely is not surprising that 76% of expenses are related to personnel, including salary, benefits and professional services. Direct client expenses are about 10% of the budget; while the balance (14%) is the miscellaneous cost of running a facility (repair and maintenance, insurance, fees, utilities, computers, copier, etc.). It is a large, complex operation and our Executive Director, Debbie Matheson, and her staff does an incredible job with the resources provided.

As an example: One of the Crisis Intervention Specialists (those individuals in place 24 hours a day to oversee the safe-house and address client needs) related to me that a year or so ago she was peeling potatoes for a meal. A client asked what she was going to do with the peels (they were to become compost for the garden). The client suggested that if they were spread on a cookie sheet, sprinkled with a bit of oil and salt, then baked, they would make nourishing chips. The Center has been doing that ever since.

I was conflicted by this story. On the one hand, it is heartening to know that every scrap is being used. On the other, it is disconcerting that we are addressing a critical community need on a budget so tight that such economies have become a necessity.

I thank you for all of your help in past years and ask for your continued support in 2012.

FVPC Introduces New Donation Procedure

Due to the safety of our clients, very limited storage space and the rising bed bug problem in Ohio, beginning in 2012 FVPC will no longer be able to accept used clothing donations at the shelter location. Furniture donations will be accepted only by prior arrangement by calling 937-376-8526 ext. 17. Specialty items, such as items from our current wish list, or food, hygiene and cleaning items will *still be accepted at the shelter by appointment*. Current needs include:

Umbrellas	Large and Extra-Large Women's Sized Pajamas (new only)
Socks (adult and child's)	Humidifiers for Cold and Flu Season
Slippers and Flip-flops	Plastic Cups
Drinking Glasses	Mugs

There is an alternative for donating your gently used items that will still benefit FVPC clients. FVPC teams up with Goodwill in Xenia and Beavercreek and Xenia Area Community Theatre for donors to give clothing and other items on behalf of FVPC. Below are the steps to make your donation:

Take items to a Xenia or Beavercreek Goodwill drop-off location or Xenia Area Community Theatre (45 E. Second St. in Xenia).

State to the individual accepting your items that you are donating on behalf of the Family Violence Prevention Center and need a receipt.

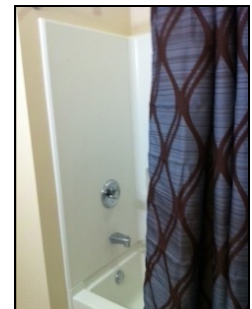
Mail your receipt to FVPC at 380 Bellbrook Ave, Xenia, Ohio 45385.

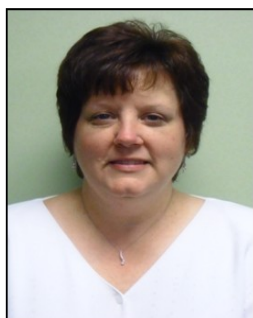
