Dear Friend of FVPC,

As we enter this New Year, FVPC seeks to ensure that we are addressing domestic and sexual violence holistically. My mind turns to the current topics circulating throughout our culture, shared through different media. This information influences the conversations we generate amongst family and friends.

A week ago, while waiting on a colleague's arrival for a lunch meeting, I took the opportunity to listen to the buzz in the restaurant. In the booth closest to me, three women were discussing circumstances around Dr. Nassar, the former Olympic doctor convicted of sexual

crimes against gymnasts and sentenced to 175 years in prison. There was genuine concern and confusion in the questions that initiated the conversation. An older woman, started the conversation, stating, "I do not want to be disrespectful to the young women who experienced sexual abuse at the hands of their doctor. How did this happen? How did the girls not know how to make it stop?" The conversation continued amongst the three women processing and exploring empathy for the complex situation the victims faced. They wondered how the parents and adults were blind to the situation, how did the young women carry this burden for so long and what would be the long term effects the young women face? The organic critical thinking skills the women used were encouraging. The process of cultural change comes from people identifying concerns and exploring solutions. Consider generating a conversation within your peer group to see how they will respond to tough questions about responsibility in victimization.

The following are questions and answers that you can use to generate a conversation:

Q: How many youth, both male and female are sexually abused before the age of 18? A: One in four girls and one in six boys will experience sexual abuse before they turn 18 years old. (1) Q: Are strangers or acquaintances the perpetrators of the majority of sexual abuse on children? A: Someone they know and trust most often sexually abuses children. (2) Q: How rare is sexual assault? A: Every 98 seconds an American is sexually assaulted. Every 8 minutes the victims is a child. Only six out of every 1000 perpetrators will end up in prison and 60% of sexual assaults are unreported to the police.(3)

To conclude, share with someone you may encounter that our staff is poised to help those victimized and their support system.
