From the Director

Dear Friends,

In the ongoing battle against domestic and sexual violence, knowledge is power. By examining the *Ohio Domestic Violence Network (ODVN) Domestic Violence Fatalities*¹ report reflective of July 1, 2022- June 30, 2023, we gain insights that can help us better understand the intricate dynamics of this pressing issue. This is the eighth annual review and it serves as a call to action, urging us to bolster our social systems in response to domestic violence.

ODVN is the state coalition at the forefront of advocating for domestic violence victims. VFF is an active member of the collation. ODVN's annual Domestic Violence Fatality report gathers data from law enforcement, crime reports, media reports and data from local domestic violence programs to provide a detailed analysis of domestic violence related fatalities in Ohio. The fatality report of July 1, 2022- June 30, 2023 is a sobering reminder of the work that still lies ahead.

Domestic violence is a societal issue, and it requires a collective response.

According to the report, domestic violence-related deaths remained the same this year at 112 fatalities. Each statistic represents a life cut short and families, torn apart. It is an urgent reminder that domestic violence remains a grave concern, despite our collective efforts.

Understanding the key findings in the fatality review offers critical insight into the dynamics surrounding domestic violence and informs action steps.

1. LETHALITY ASSESSMENT

The reviews emphasize the importance of lethality assessments by first responders. Enhancing training and tools can help identify high risk situations enabling timely intervention.

2. INTERSECTIONALITY

Domestic violence does not discriminate, underline the necessity of addressing intersectionality, considering factors, such as race, gender, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status, one offering support and protection.

3. COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Building stronger community networks can be a lifeline for victims. The report stresses the need for communities to work in unison, offering refuge and resources to those in need.

4. LEGAL PROTECTIONS

A renewed focus on strengthening, legal protections, and support for survivors is essential. The report highlight gaps in the systems that need to be addressed to better safeguard victims. "100 people were shot in the 82 cases, only 15 survived their injuries."

The statewide report and the local statistic should serve as a catalyst for change in our response in Greene County. Here are steps, we can take to become more resilient in response to domestic violence:

1. EDUCATION AND AWARENESS:

Starts with awareness by educating yourself and others about the signs of domestic violence and know that we are a resource.

2. SUPPORT ORGANIZATIONS

Local organizations and our shelter plays a crucial role in assisting victims. Consider giving of your time, resources or funds to these vital groups.

3. LEGISLATION AND POLICY ADVOCACY

Advocate for stronger domestic and sexual violence legislation and policies in your community. Encourage elected officials to prioritize the issue.

4. COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

Empower your community to stand against domestic and sexual violence. Support initiatives that promote healthy relationships and foster open dialogue.

5. OFFER A HELPING HAND

If you suspect someone is in an abusive situation, offer help and support. Be a compassionate, and non-judgmental friend.

Domestic violence is a societal issue, and it requires a collective response. The ODVN fatality report is a wake-up call that reminds us of the urgency of our mission: Hope and healing for survivors of domestic and sexual violence." By understanding the dynamics and strengthening our social system, we can hope to break the cycle of violence and provide a safer, more nurturing environment one survivor at a time.
